Come into the Garden

With Kate Gardner

Have you felt the fizz – that feeling like something is happening as the days become lighter as we move towards the spring equinox on 20th March. The snowdrops and crocus are now in full bloom, green shoots of daffodils are starting to make their appearance and lots of scented shrubs are wafting their amazing fragrance around the village.



Last month I was looking at seed catalogues over a cuppa, but now that my seeds packets have arrived its really tempting to want to sow them all at once. Now is the perfect time to be sowing hardy annuals and sweet peas. These are plants that will grow, flower and set seed between now and the end of the autumn and once germinated will live happily outside with minimal protection. If you choose your varieties well, you could have lots of home grown cut flowers to share too. Good things to try alongside the sweet peas include Statice, Antirrhinum (snap dragons), Calendula (marigold), Nigella (love in the mist), Phlox, Scabiosa and Stocks.

Warm compost is essential so if yours has been siting outside over the winter it's worth bringing the bag inside overnight and sowing once it's warmed up. Seeds sown into cold compost sulk and take longer to germinate. Hardy annual seeds don't need lots of deep compost as they are only in the soil for a short period of time. Use a relatively shallow container (mushroom or soft fruit trays are great – just remember to put holes into the bottom for drainage), use enough compost to almost fill and then gently press the compost to level and firm it up. If It's too loose or too firm the seeds can struggle to get going. Because many of the seeds are really tiny, I will water my tray of compost before I sow the seeds, that way you don't risk washing the tiny seeds away to the sides.

Don't be tempted to sow the entire packet. You want to aim to sow between 10 and 15 seeds at a time. Try to space them out on the surface of the compost and then sprinkle lightly with some more compost. Put them somewhere light and warm to germinate (which can take anything from a few days to a couple of weeks depending on the plant). Once the baby plants are starting to show they can be moved outside into a cold frame or green house. If you don't have one use a sheltered spot in the garden and protect with some horticultural fleece if frost is forcast. They will grow slowly and won't get long and leggy (which often happens when they stay on a window sill for too long). Don't' forget to label your pots with the plant name. For a longer flowering season repeat this step in about 4 to 6 weeks time. In about 4 weeks, once the true leaves have appeared, your baby plants will need prickling out into their own separate 7 - 9 cm pots where they will develop nice health roots until they are ready to either pot on again or go out into the ground.

Sweet peas can also be sown now but you treat them a little differently. I always use 7cm pots and sow about 5 seeds into each container. To sow the seed, use a peat-free, multi-purpose potting compost. Dampen the compost, then, with your finger, push each seed in 2-3cm below the surface of the compost then gently cover the seeds then label the pot and put on a warm windowsill to germinate.


If you want to find out more about growing from seed, then do join us at the Bloomin Well community garden on Saturday mornings between 12 and 2pm where we will be sowing all manner of vegetables, fruit and flowers alongside our usual garden development tasks.

The front cover picture in the April 1980's issue of Spotlight is of "A tempting array of Easter confections" while the editorial is so very apt to us now. "We have been hearing so much in recent times regarding the cuts which are occurring all around us, that it Is easy to overlook the plight of those who really cannot survive the consequences of such.



It is indeed a pleasure then to

report in these pages the continued success of several fund-raising activities in the village, together with the undying support given to these affairs by the people of Clophill." (How very true this is still – the recent coffee morning in the church to raise funds for a Paraguayan girl is testament to this!)

Fundraisers back in March 1980 were held in the **Methodist Church** where "some fifty friends enjoyed a Ploughman's supper served by the ladies of the church. A Bring and Buy stall was well patronised. The proceeds of £59.00 were shared by the Church and the Home Missions fund.

Reflections – Clophill in March 1980 - continued ...

St. Mary's School saw the tradition of 'Lent Appeal' with monies raised for The Ampthill & District branch of the Arthritis and Rheumatism Council by the children's own fund-raising methods - shoe cleaning, wellie-wanging, lucky dip, how many peas in a jar, beat the goalie, cake sale, concerts, name the rabbit and suchlike, all organised so enthusiastically by the children at break and lunchtimes – and being concluded by a mini-marathon run by Father Philip and the acting head Clive King in the pouring rain!

Further fundraisers in the village were for **The Church of England's Children's** Society and in a 'Letter to the Editor' organiser, Penny Horsnail thanked the generosity of the village and the collectors - Anita Errick, Eileen Martin, Janet Lewis, Janet Poad, Stella Brooks, Su Cam, Joanne Constance and Alwyn and Isobel Ullman for their help in raising £80.

At Brownies "four sixers Caroline Duggan, Emma Thoulass, Colette Whittles and Lucie Young presented a donation of £15" to 'Handicapped Riders' after watching a film which included scenes from Millbrook and Moggerhanger riding centres. There was to be a Great Sponsored Swim in May as part of a country–wide event while the **Guides** collected 3tons 1cwt of newspaper raising £30.50 for their funds. (Clophill was – and still is a very caring and supportive village.)

Other activities going on in March involved the **Village Hall Committee** announcing the date of the Village Fete - June 21st and asking for help as well as saying that best part of the loan from the Parish Council had been repaid while "Outline proposals for a new storage extension, to cost nearly £1,500, have been accepted in principle. This is much needed for storing equipment, including stalls for the Fete."

The **WI meeting** took the form of Craft demonstrations by various members. "Mrs Carol Whysall showed beautiful machine embroidering; Mrs Marilyn Everitt presented a selection of uncooked sweets; Mrs Kate Smith made basketry look easy, as did Mrs Judi Gibbs when demonstrating her macramé hanging baskets."

The Children's Competition was to "Draw and colour a picture on the theme of SPRINGTIME. Crayons, felt pens or paints may be used. There will be first and second prizes and the competition is open to children up to and including 10 years old. Results of the March competition (decorate and egg) – 1st - 'Prima Donna' - Hazel Brooks (aged 8) and 2nd - 'Humpty Dumpty'– Amanda Telford (aged 10) with Highly Commended Robert Brooks (7) and Rachel Bodiley (9).

Hello everyone,

We are halfway through the academic year already, where does the time go? We have lots of new starters joining us this half term and it's been great to welcome our new families. For those younger children, staff have been doing lots of parachute games, keeping them moving in the cold, supporting physical development and allowing children to get to know each other through fun interactions. Our older children have been working towards their Ruby Robin Awards: a program put in place by the Songbird Survival Organisation to raise awareness and funds for the protection of UK songbirds. The children have been bird spotting, doing quizzes, learning about bird anatomy and completing colouring pictures of birds accurately using reference books and field guides. Through collaboration and using their design skills the children set about making a bird bath to go in our nature garden using found materials.


We are lucky to have a good supply of woodchip at preschool from Chris's husband Gary, we use it for all sorts from the mud pit to the allotment. We had a huge mound sitting there recently and so all the staff and children went out with buckets, spades, wheel barrows and pretty much anything they could fill to move the chip into the setting to help soak up the muddy ground in the garden. Great work team!

Katie from Silsoe Dance and Rachel from Adventure yoga have been as popular as ever out in the garden. Children have been brilliant at waiting their turn to have a go at deep breathing with the ball, just one of the many ways we work on wellbeing, mindfulness and self-regulation at preschool. Staff are also noticing children who have previously only watched Kate from afar are now starting to join in with her dancing as their confidence grows and they feel comfortable to have a go.

It was National Storytelling week at the start of February and the whole of preschool acted out We're Going on a Bear Hunt around the garden. The 11th February was Safer Internet Day, the older children listened to a story about staying safe online and then took the opportunity from their earlier story work, to think up their own endings. Story work is so important for children: it significantly contributes to a child's language development, sparks their imagination, helps them explore emotions, and provides a window into different cultures and experiences, laying a strong foundation for future learning and social understanding.

Our understanding of the value of stories is what prompted us to join the Department of Education and Oxford University in a research study for Talking Time: a universal oral language programme for children aged 3 to 5 supporting practitioners to deliver engaging, structured small-group activities to children and enhance oral language through high-quality interactions. Our staff are always keen to enhance their knowledge and we continue to be very proud of our fantastic team.
